Also managing emotional reactions, planning for the future. So, what if we damage this area? If you damage this area, you're probably going to have problems making decisions. You probably are going to have problems behaving appropriately in social situations, because all of a sudden, you don't really know what is socially right and socially wrong. Patients with Prefrontal Cortex damage tend to perform poorly on tasks that require the use of long-term strategies and the inhibition of impulses. they often display short-term memory deficits, which may help to explain some of the difficulties in planning.
